Jext® is indicated in the emergency treatment of severe acute allergic reactions (anaphylaxis) to insect stings or bites, foods, drugs and other allergens as well as idiopathic or exercise induced anaphylaxis.




Education of patients and caregivers is crucial to ensure timely and correct handling and administration of adrenaline in emergency situations, and consequently an important part of risk management for the patient. Knowledge of proper administration technique and device care furthermore decreases the risk of accidental or unnecessary drug administration, minimizing the risk of adverse reactions.



The purpose of this check list is to aid you as the prescriber in instructing the patient and/or caregivers in correct use, storage and care of Jext®. The checklist may be used as a general instructional tool or for documenting consultations of individual patients.

prescribing. **Name** Jext 150 micrograms solution for injection cardiovascular in pre-filled pen Jext 300 micrograms solution for injection in phaeochromocytoma, narrow angle glaucoma, severe pre-filled pen **Active Ingredients** Jext 150 micrograms: One renal impairment, prostatic adenoma leading to residual pre-filled pen delivers one dose of 0.15ml solution for injection urine, hypercalcaemia, hypokalaemia and diabetes. 

Jext[®]: Instructions For Use

1,



Grasp the Jext® injector in your dominant hand (the one you use to write with) with your thumb closest to the yellow cap.

2,



Pull off the yellow cap with your other hand.

3



Place the black injector tip against your outer thigh, holding the injector at a right angle (approx 90°) to the thigh.

4,



Push the black tip firmly into your outer thigh until you hear a 'click' confirming the injection has started, then keep it pushed in. Hold the injector firmly in place against the thigh for 10 seconds (a slow count to 10) then remove. The black tip will extend automatically and hide the needle.

5,



Massage the injection area for 10 seconds. Seek immediate medical help.
